GREATER SHILOH TABERNACLE M.B.C. CHURCH HISTORY

The Spirit of God began to move within Rev. Willie C. Claiborne, Jr. while attending church services at New Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church family, Pastor Danny R. Hector, Jr.

On February 20, 2010, Rev. Willie C. Claiborne, Jr. organized and named the Greater Shiloh Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church. The church was formed with 15 charter members.

Rev. Claiborne, Jr. began to share the vision and encouraged the members to remain strong and faithful and God will bless. He informed the members that we would have Wednesday night bible study at 7pm. Rev. Willie Claiborne, Sr. & Sis. Ernestine Claiborne opened their doors to our first bible study held on February 24, 2010 and Sis. Clacy Washington opened her home the following week. Our Wednesday night bible study allowed for the Greater Shiloh family to grow closer together.

As the spirit of God continued to lead Pastor Claiborne, Jr. he contacted Sis. Angelanet Allen about having services at Shadydale Elementary School. She referred Rev. Claiborne, Jr. to Pastor Johnny Gentry, Free Indeed Ministries. On February 28, 2010, Rev. & Sis. Claiborne, Jr. visited with Pastor & First Lady Gentry and the power of God moved quickly. Pastor Gentry and his leaders agreed to allow the Greater Shiloh church family to have Sunday services at 11am at 10306 Homestead Road on March 14, 2010.

On March 14, 2010, our first service was held at 10306 Homestead Road.

Rev. Willie C. Claiborne, Jr. called a meeting immediately following the services. Rev. W. C. Claiborne, Jr. discussed the lease agreement made with Free Indeed Ministries and all the members agreed with the agreement.

Continually being led by God, Rev. W. C. Claiborne, Jr. appointed officers of the church. The financial committee members were Dec. Dan Helm, Finance Chairman, Sis. Latoya Claiborne, Sis. Gladys Claiborne (financial trustees) and Sis. Carolyn Helm, Church Clerk. Sis. Marilyn Claiborne was appointed as the Pastor's secretary.

The Greater Shiloh church established the order of service.

The church slogan was adopted "Shiloh! God's Way, We Walk By Faith!" and the church colors were chosen - Purple & Gold.

On March 21, 2010, 19 members officially joined under Christian Experience.

The Greater Shiloh church family began the journey and has been working diligently in the Scenic Woods and Fontaine area.

In December, 2010, the Lord blessed the Greater Shiloh family to purchase our current building at 10306 Homestead Road.

On January 9, 2011, Pastor Claiborne, Jr. hired a musician and he changed the time of church services to 8:00am. It was then Pastor Claiborne, Jr. organized the Uplift immediately following morning worship - inspirational teachers, Sis. Betty Bailey, Sis. Marilyn Claiborne and Sis. Carolyn Helm.

The church was blessed with several gifts through the love of God - a piano, pews, a pulpit and many other contributions. The Greater Shiloh church continues to grow spiritually and financially.

On March 13, 2011, Greater Shiloh celebrated its 1st Church Anniversary. It has been a tedious journey but the church remains steadfast and unmovable always abounding in the Work of God. God is adding as HE sees fit Pastor has baptized 11 new souls. As we embrace the 10th year, we rejoice in knowing the Foundation of the Church is laid To God Be The Glory.

We are humbled by the hand of God for his continuous grace and mercy. On June 1, 2018, Greater Shiloh Tabernacle paid the last note. On July 29, 2018, Greater Shiloh held a "Note Burning Celebration" celebrating and praising God for the gift. We are truly grateful for 10 blessed years!!!
