THE LIFE OF *Ginger*

Ginger Laraine Turner-Anderson, the surviving twin, and first born of Simmie and Rosa Turner was born June 27, 1943 in the East Texas town of Pittsburg, TX.; The Family moved to Dallas, TX at the age of two where she completed elementary and high school. Ginger developed leadership and management skills at an early age as she was the elder sister to four younger brothers. She was "Straw-boss"; and, as such, oversaw the completion of daily household responsibilities. She was also the female 100 yard sprint champion in the east Dallas community.

After graduating from high school, she moved to Los Angeles, CA to continue her education where she attended Los Angeles City College and Compton Junior College. After thirteen years in the Los Angeles area, she and her family moved to Houston, Texas.

Ginger worked as a claims adjustor in Los Angeles and was one of the first females in that field. After moving to Houston, she was Houston's first female of color with an All-Line license to write estimates on automobiles and 18-wheelers in addition to handling various other claims. One major accomplishment during that time, was overseeing and instructing to resolution, company involvement in a train wreck. She retired in December, 1999 and began to focus on her life-long dream of becoming an entrepreneur.

Ginger drew upon her desire to create special and lasting personal affect items. Thus, "Ginger's Creations" was launched. She manufactured specialty Jewelry including necklaces, earrings, bracelets and anklets. Her creativity and work quality caused many of her customers to return with personal wants and desires relying solely upon her unique ability to create. Her products often times became special to her and she refused to sale them.

Ginger was among the initial members of St. Johns and immediately became very active in a variety of ministries, including serving as an assistant in Children's Church, an usher and treasurer for many years, The Couples and Diamonds and Pearls ministries, where she was treasurer for many years. She also participates in St. Johns' Wednesday food program.

Ginger met Leonard Anderson while in the third grade, they married December 27, 1961. The family grew to include three children, Felecia, Ginard and Terence. As a mother, Ginger instilled the meaning of hard work and self-reliance in her three children during the formative years of their lives. Her belief in the importance of obtaining a quality education motivated her to invest both energy and resources to ensure that her children would be equipped to compete in the business world. She was able to see the three of them earn Bachelor's degrees and one earn a JD.

on October 26, 2020, God called Ginger to eternal rest. She was preceded in death by her father and one brother, Bobby Turner. She is survived by her mother and husband, Leonard of fifty-eight years and ten months; three children: Felecia, Ginard and Terence (Tonya); brothers: Cecil Turner, Ralph Turner and Victor Turner; grandson: Bryce Anderson; granddaughter: Ashley Anderson; one godson: Byron Jackson and a host of nieces, nephews, extended family and friends.
